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experiencing the lifespan draws from a variety of cultures around the world to tell the story of human development communicating the science and human impact of developmental psychology in a highly conversational style

this book sets forth a new model of development from a causal perspective as this is an area vital to several disciplines it has been written at multiple levels and for multiple audiences it is based on the work of piaget and neo piagetians but also covers other major models in development it has elements that make it attractive as a teaching text but it is especially research focused it has clinical applications it presents many new ideas and models consistent with the existing literature which is reviewed extensively students researchers and practitioners should find it useful the models presented in the present work build on models introduced in prior publications e g young 1990a 1990b 1997

the processes by which family members adjust to the birth of a second child are explored in this volume interviews with both parents and with toddler first born children focused on how the birth of the second child affected the relationships between other family members their roles within the family and their feelings about themselves a major finding was that while mothers become active parents on the birth of the first child it is often not until the second child is born that the father shows great interest in family life and assumes a significant part of the responsibility for household and childcare tasks
